# **Appian Multi-Asset Fund**

The Appian Multi-Asset Fund (the Fund) is a multi-asset fund that has a long-term track record of positive risk-adjusted returns with lower volatility. It is a diversified fund that invests in a comprehensive range of traditional and alternative asset classes which includes equities, fixed income, property, infrastructure, venture capital, commodities, forestry and currencies.

The Fund is characterised by a dynamic strategic asset allocation process that seeks to ensure the reduction of risk and variations in value. The Fund further reduces its risk profile and increases levels of diversification by investing across a variety of geographic areas and sectors.

#### Fund objective

This Fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing on a diversified basis in transferable securities, such as equity securities and debt securities, and collective investment schemes (including exposure to alternatives such as property and forestry).

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
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
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#### Sector weighting of equities
